VAX-11/750 is here Digital unveils new minicomputer

Digital has just introduced its second VAX computer system, the industry's first custom Large Scale Integration (LSI) 32-bit minicomputer. The VAX-11/750 is a virtual memory computer which uses an advanced LSI circuit technology to achieve low cost and compactness for a wide variety of environments.



Digital's new VAX-11/750

The new system's central processing unit (CPU) uses high-density electronic microcircuits called "gate arrays" and fulfills 60 percent of the performance of the larger VAX-11/780 at 40 percent of its CPU price. The miniaturization reduces printed board space by two-thirds, and power consumption and heat by half. These savings permit smaller cabinets, lower cooling requirements, less noise, more flexible installation and greater reliability.

President Ken Olsen said, "When the VAX-11/780 was introduced in 1977, I said that I considered it to be the most significant interactive computer of the decade. I would include the new 750 in that statement today."

Gate array chips for the VAX-11/750 are among the first semiconductor products of LSI Manufacturing's new plant in Hudson, Mass., where they are designed and manufactured. Product development for the VAX-11/750 was performed at the Tewksbury facility. The VAX-11/750 manufacturing locations include Burlington, Vt., Westminster, Mass., Galway, Ireland, and Ayr, Scotland.

In university and medical research, VAX-11/750 will be a choice system for chemical synthesis modeling, image analysis in nuclear medicine, bioengineering research, prosthetic design and psychological and artificial intelligence studies. And the new system has sufficient power to be used in high energy physics and laser fusion, or function as a primary installation for administrative and academic processing.

The system can support graphic workstations for engineering analysis, manufacturing monitoring and control equipment. Don McInnis, VAX-11/750 product manager, said, "It will be a powerful image processor for graphic display systems and for drafting systems used in computer-assisted design and manufacturing. It can monitor multiple automatic test equipment stations to assess tolerance, performance and reliability of electronic components and assemblies. And in closed-loop control it will find application in power transmission networks, radar tracking and guidance

First quarter sales up 34%

Digital reported total operating revenues of \$654,370,000 for the first quarter of the fiscal year, up 34 percent from the \$487,538,000 recorded in the comparable period a year ago.

Net income for the quarter totaled \$56,204,000 or \$1.17 per share on 52,142,589 average common and common equivalent shares outstanding versus \$45,239,000 or \$1.02 per share on 45,647,446 average common and common equivalent shares outstanding last year.

systems, and in military command and control." In energy research it can serve in mineral and petroleum exploration.

The VAX-11/750 also retains a compatibility link with a wide range of PDP-11 software. This gives thousands of PDP-11 users a low-cost entry into 32-bit processing without sacrificing their present investments. Digital can now offer a selection of 32-bit computer systems ranging in price from under \$50,000 to \$500,000. Volume deliveries are scheduled to start in April 1981.

The company also announced the RM80, a new 124-megabyte, Winchester-type disk drive for VAX systems, and the formation of the new series of VAX-based DEC DATASYSTEM 700s. The disk unit, manufactured in Colorado Springs, is a sealed assembly which improves reliability with the absence of risk of contamination by the removal of disk packs and cartridges. It has almost twice the storage capacity of the current RM03 at the same price and at a lower maintenance cost. The RM80 operates under normal office environmental conditions.

The new DEC DATASYSTEM 700s can support up to 64 users simultaneously for commercial data entry applications for use in insurance companies, sales departments, manufacturing sites, warehouses and distribution centers.

Worldwide demand for Digital's products remained strong during the quarter, despite the fact that some customers are feeling the effect of the recession. The company anticipates that incoming business and orders already received for its products and services will remain firm for the remainder of the fiscal year. Customer service revenues of \$175 million rose by 40 percent in the first quarter. Digital's worldwide customer support organization of over 20,000 people provide a wide range of sales, service, software and educational support services.

President Ken Olsen said "The company's strong, competitive product offering, led by the high performance VAX-11/780 computer, resulted in 34% revenue growth in the first quarter. Our leadership position in the 32-bit market was further strengthened with the introduction of a smaller and less expensive member of the VAX family, the VAX-11/750."

The quarter also saw a continuation of the company's substantial plant expansion program. Nearly \$109 million was spent on property, plant and equipment aimed at providing sufficient capacity to meet customer demand into the mid-1980's. Full year spending should approximate \$400 million versus the \$210 million spent in fiscal year 1980.

At the end of the first quarter, Digital had more than 57,000 employees worldwide and had shipped more than a quarter of a million computers.

He took things into his own hands and became a life saver

"I was sitting in the cafeteria just getting ready to leave. Then I heard this lady coughing, she was standing there, all red in the face, trying to catch her breath. She was at a table full of people, but they didn't seem to know what to do. So I jumped up and...." Bill Rivers

Last Monday during lunch in the PK3 cafeteria, Bill Rivers saved another Digital employee, who wishes to remain anonymous, from choking. When Bill jumped to her aid, he applied the Heimlich Maneuver, a technique used to dislodge an object obstructing a person's breathing passage. Bill had no training in life saving or the Maneuver, but he had once read a story about a woman choking in a restaurant. The story included a diagram illustrating the technique.

In a few critical minutes, Bill recalled the article and managed to react quick enough to save a life. He has received letters of commendation from President Ken Olsen, Shel Davis, vice president of Personnel, John Sims, manager of Corporate Employee Relations, Cabby Belanger, Plant Engineer, Jackie Edwards, R.N., Health Services, Scott Emery, Security, and from the grateful person he saved.

After his feat of quick thinking and skill in the cafeteria, Bill Rivers received an enthusiastic round of applause. I am sure all Digital would like to join in.

Each facility has four or five certified life savers. And when Health Services has enough nurses trained as teachers, the course will be open to all employees. Contact your Red Cross for dates and times of on-going sessions in your community.

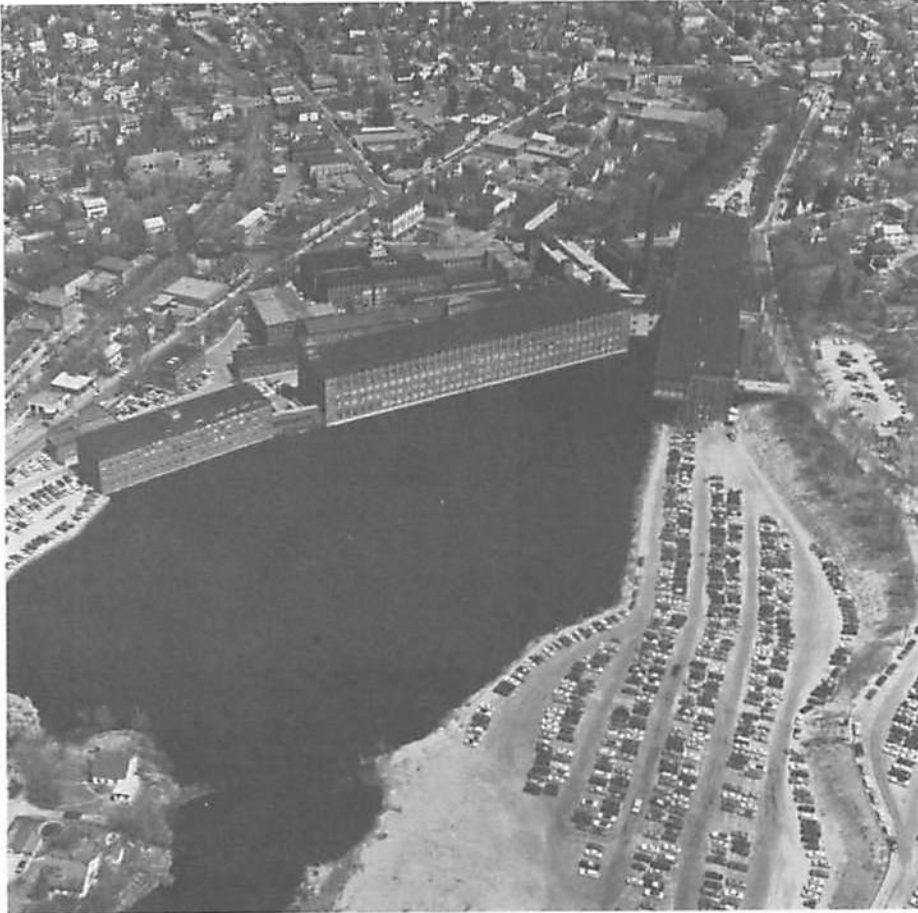
