4. There will be an Initiation Fee of \$1.00 for a MAYNARD CENTENNIAL BELLE badge and card.
5. Any Belle late for a meeting will be fined 10 cents.
6. Each Belle will pay 25 cents dues at each meeting.
7. Any Belle missing more than 3 meetings in succession without just cause may be relieved of duty. Notification of absence should be made in advance of meeting to one of the Belles so they can properly report it at the meeting.
8. Permission to speak is gained by raising your hand and being recognized by the Chairwoman and any Belle speaking without recognition will be fined 5 cents.

The Treasurer's report was read and accepted.


Next thanked the girls for their help on the float and showed everyone the award. A charter was signed which will go to the Historical
