RCS and EMS are history

RCS and EMS, which were once Digital's main means of internal electronic communications, are gone.

RCS (Record Communications System), or Digital's internal "TWX" system, had been around since 1979. It replaced the CMS (Corporate Message Services) system, which could no longer expand enough to meet Digital's growing needs. RCS grew from approximately 300 to over 800 locations worldwide. Some RCS codes served small or remote departments, while others served entire facilities. RCS also played an important part in the sale and trade of Digital stock, and in corresponding with outside companies with TWX and Telex machines.

EMS (Electronic Mail System) also grew quickly, from a few mail accounts in 1979 to over 8,600 by 1981. One EMS node led to two, and the network quickly spread to 15 nodes. The demands on each system increased, and finally the traffic overload began causing performance problems.

MTS (Message Transport Service), the basis of DECmail, VAXmail, ALL-IN-1 Mail and other user agents, came along in 1983. The MTS network is based on Digital standard products. Unlike RCS and EMS, it had the capability of growing large enough to support the messaging needs of the entire corporation without decreasing performance or response time.

So the decision was made to migrate EMS and RCS to MTS as smoothly and painlessly as possible. This was accomplished through the time and effort of the RCS and EMS Service staff. After the migration was complete, the last EMS node was laid to rest on March 19, and a ceremonious RCS shutdown took place on March 29.

Digital recognizes support of Mass.

In a brief ceremony at its Northeast Technology Center in the Shrewsbury facility, Digital presented a plaque to the Commonwealth of Massachusetts. In presenting the award, Al Mullin, vice president, Corporate Relations, recognized the assistance and contributions made by the Commonwealth to the growth and expansion of Digital in Massachusetts. Accepting the award was Alden Raine, Director of the Governor's Office of Economic Affairs.

All noted the importance of public-private partnerships in the state's economic development, using the Shrewsbury facility as an example of public officials working together with a company to solve a transportation issue. He cited the assistance of state and Shrewsbury officials in locating traffic lights at the South Street intersection in Shrewsbury.

Describing activities that complement public-private partnerships, AI referred to some programs that demonstrate Digital's community initiatives. He mentioned that Digital provided more than \$600,000 in cash and equipment to several Bay State Skills Corporation-sponsored employment and training programs, and Central Massachusetts Job Training, Inc., for its Office Automation Training Centers. Also, through the Employee Matching Gift Program, Digital donated more than \$1.2 million in employee and company-matched funds to Mass. non-profit organizations during fiscal 1985.

Digital and DECUS: 25 years of partnership

April marks a quarter of a century of cooperation between the world's largest non-profit computer users' society and the second largest computer company. During those 25 years the Digital Equipment Computer Users' Society (DECUS) has grown dramatically from a meeting in a French restaurant in Maynard in 1961 to its current 90,000 members. And that membership is still growing.

In the early days Digital's main customers were research institutes and universities who made it their task to voice useful issues to the manufacturer. DECUS was established by a group of PDP-1 users whose main interest was to share their knowledge and experience. The guiding principles of DECUS have not altered in 25 years. The society still aims at fulfilling two key roles: to provide information exchange among the

users, and an exchange between the users and Digital.

Feedback from the user to manufacturer allows the customers to tell the manufacturer about their future needs and so helps the development of products that the market really needs — a good way for the manufacturer to protect its customer base and to stay in business.


DECUS is a user-directed organization, supported in part by Digital. It is governed by an elected Board of Directors, made up of members of the user community and a representative appointed by Digital. The presence of Digital personnel on the board is to represent Digital's voice on matters affecting both DECUS members and Digital. This underscores the working partnership. Membership in DECUS is free. Enrollment is growing at about 1,000 per month.

Operator Training Program

Sixth Offering: July 28 Application Deadline: June 16

The Operator Training Program (OTP) is designed to train Digital full-time personnel who are eligible for transfer to become Computer Operators. The 17-week program consists of one week of orientation, four weeks of classroom training and lab, followed by 12 weeks of on-the-job training.

The first four weeks of on-the-job training are typically spent at a data center other than the trainee's permanent job assignment. The next eight weeks are spent working in the sponsoring manager's data center. Formal training includes Hardware, Software and Communication Concepts, Data Center Procedures and Standards, and an emphasis on verbal communication skills. The hands-on laboratory experience is focused on the VAX.

Upon satisfactory completion of the program, the trainee will be promoted to an Operator II (D61) and will work in the sponsoring data center on a full-time basis.

Participation in the program requires a minimum of a one-year commitment to work for the sponsor after program completion (total of one year and 17 weeks). Additionally, there must be commitments by the trainee to work other than first shift as most data centers operate on a 24-hour, sevenday basis and to not take any time off during the training.



'Expert system' creates MRO2 lobby murals

Internationally known artist Harold Cohen was at Digital's MRO2 facility in Marlboro recently to install the third mural in the cycle "Four Seasonal Narratives." This 9-by-19-foot work is the latest in a commissioned series Cohen began six years ago for The Computer Museum when it was housed in MRO2.

All three mural drawings were done by "Aaron," an expert system (also known as an intelligent program) written by Cohen on VAX-11/750 and MicroVAX II computers. "My express purpose in developing this particular expert system was to answer the question, "What do people do when they make drawings of things?"" said Cohen, who also created the machine that functions as Aaron's "drawing hand." The earliest versions of this expert system date back to 1977.

Aaron is distinguished for its autonomous creative behavior. As a knowledge-based system, it does not have drawings or parts of drawings stored in it, but has knowledge of things it is drawing and of how to draw. In its early version, Aaron was able to differentiate between figure and ground, between open and closed forms, and between what is inside and outside an object. It continues to do this, but now has enough knowledge about objects in the world to compose these objects into a 2-1/2-dimensional landscape space. Since 1983, Aaron has produced more than 7,000 original drawings. Cohen then applies acrylic paint to the black and white drawings created by Aaron.

A leading abstract painter in London in the '60s, Cohen began experimenting with computers after moving to the San Diego

area 17 years ago. He teaches art at the University of California in San Diego, and has had one-man shows at the Tate Gallery in London, the DeCordova Museum in Lincoln, Mass., The Brooklyn Museum, the San Francisco Museum of Modern Art, and the Capitol Children's Museum in Washington, D.C. Cohen was featured in the U.S. Pavillion at Expo-85 in Tsukuba, Japan. He was an invited lecturer at the International Joint Conference on Artificial Intelligence (IJCAI) in Tokyo in 1979, and is the co-author of "The First Artificial Intelligence Coloring Book" published by William Kaufmann, Inc. 1984.
