## Tony Lauck named Corporate Consulting Engineer



Tony Lauck

Tony Lauck has been promoted to the position of Corporate Consulting Engineer. In this position, Tony reports to Jac Simensen, Group Manager, Networks and Communications, and Mahendra Patel, Technical Director, Distributed Systems. Tony is responsible for the company's architecture and advanced development efforts in distributed systems.

In announcing the promotion, Jac commented, "Tony Lauck is an industry figure. He is known, respected and listened to by the best technical minds in the data communications community."

Tony joined Digital in 1974 as Product Manager for PDP-11 Communications Hardware. In 1977, he assumed responsibility for the Digital Network Architecture, completing DECnet Phase II, and directing the development of DECnet Phase III and Phase IV. Tony was a member of Digital's Interconnect Task Force, which in 1979 recommended

that the company develop a local area network. That resulted in the joint development of Ethernet by Intel, Xerox Corp., and Digital. He also played a leading role in the development of the IEEE standard 802.3 for CSMA/CD local area networks, an outgrowth of Ethernet.

In 1980, Tony also became responsible for Communications Advanced Development, a group which began the prototypes for the DECserver-100 Ethernet terminal server, and the LAN Bridge-100 for high-speed interconnection of Ethernets.

Tony also has led Digital's efforts to support the multi-vendor computer networks, which are becoming standardized under the Open System Interconnect (OSI) program of the International Standards Organization.

In 1985, Tony was chosen by Science Digest as one of "America's 100 Brightest Scientists Under 40." He is the author of *(continued on page 11)*

## Ground broken for Science Discovery Museum in Acton

A group of shovel-wielding youngsters broke ground early this month for the Science Discovery Museum in Acton. The museum will be built on a site adjacent to the Children's Discovery Museum. Construction of the facility was made possible in part by a three-year, \$100,000 Digital grant which was made to the museum in 1984.

The Science Discovery Museum is designed for young people from 6 to 16. Part of Digital's grant to the museum is earmarked for developing hands-on exhibits through which youngsters can learn the scientific principles that govern mathematics, computers and technology.

According to Win Hindle, senior vice president, Corporate Operations, "Digital and the Children's Discovery Museum share similar goals. We believe in interactive computing and the museum believes in interactive exhibits for children."

Digital has supported the Children's Discovery Museum through cash and equipment grants and matching funding through the Employee Matching Gift Program since the museum was founded in 1982. Digital's support of the two museums is part of the company's ongoing commitment to the communities where employees live and work. ■

## Digital announces MicroPDP-11/53 computer

Digital has announced a new low-end member of its PDP-11 family with more than twice the performance of its previous entry-level MicroPDP-11/23 system at approximately the same price. The MicroPDP-11/53 handles up to eight users simultaneously, twice as many as possible with the MicroPDP-11/23. The system features new half-height disk storage peripherals and a 15-MHz version of the company's proprietary J-11 processor chip.

The MicroPDP-11/53 system is available in both pedestal and rack-mount versions. The new system is fully software compatible with other members of the PDP-11 computer family. It can take full advantage of more than 2,000 application programs preserving software investments in the more than half million PDP-11 systems delivered to date.

Markets for the new system include real-time process control, small business, science, communications, and government. System prices are from \$9,270, with deliveries beginning in August.

The MicroPDP-11/53 system is the first of the Q-bus-based microcomputer systems family to have a single-board processor in-

cluding memory, with 0.5 Mbytes on the processor board. The system is expandable to as much as 4 Mbytes memory. The new half-height disk storage products provide as much as 41.2 Mbytes of built-in storage.

The system incorporates Digital's Q-bus architecture, enabling users to add standard PDP-11 microcomputer peripheral devices such as disk or tape drives. Through the company's DEQNA interface, the MicroPDP-11/53 system can become a full network partner on Digital's DECnet/Ethernet local area network (LAN), able to share resources with other PDP-11 and VAX computer systems.

Digital has also announced its first half-height 5½-inch floppy-disk drive. The RX33 floppy disk drive provides up to 1.2 Mbyte storage capacity per diskette. The new drive is Digital's first to accept diskettes in both the company's RX50 format and the IBM PC-AT format. This facility enables users to interchange file media between PDP-11 systems and other manufacturer's desktop computers. A 5¼-inch half-height Winchester-technology disk is also available. ■

## Three new titles available from Digital Press

### VAX Architecture Reference Manual (order no. EY-3459E-DP)

Whether you're a VAX assembly language or systems programmer, a system architect or a Digital engineer, this is the book you'll refer to for a full understanding of Digital's VAX family of computers. The book describes the data types, instructions, calling standards, addressing modes, registers, exception and interrupt handling, memory management, and process structure common to all VAX computers.

The VAX Architecture Reference Manual is edited by Timothy S. Leonard, senior engineer and VAX architect, who works in Digital's 32-bit Architecture group. The book's foreword is written by Sam Fuller, vice president, Corporate Research and Architecture. Cost for this 416-page hard-

bound book is \$36. Digital employees may purchase a copy for \$18.

**Kermit: A File Transfer Protocol** (order no. EY-6705E-DP), by Frank da Cruz, manager of Systems Integration at the Columbia University Center for Computing Activities.

This is a book for those who move information from one computer to another. Kermit, the computer file transfer protocol developed at Columbia University, has widespread popularity. It is flexible and readily adapted to new situations; it comes with source code; and user documentation is thorough. In addition, the protocol itself is documented, and reproduction and sharing are encouraged. Available as public domain software, Kermit runs on all computers manufactured by Digital.

From instructions for basic use to a formal description of the Kermit protocol, this book is an introduction, a manual, and a comprehensive reference for those who wish to create Kermit programs, make general use of Kermit, or wish to support its use in their departments.

The 384-page paperbound book costs \$25; Digital employees and cost centers may obtain a copy for \$12.50.

**A Programmer's Guide to Common LISP** (order no. EY-6706E-DP) This book leads programmers and other computer specialists through the often difficult stages of learning LISP by introducing the basic assumptions, style, and functions of the language. In a lively, easy-to-follow style, the book aims at giving users a high level of competence in LISP. Readers discover how to create difficult constructs such as nested backquotes and macro-defining macros;

## Digital, Department of Revenue sign contract

The Massachusetts Department of Revenue has signed a five-year contract with Digital to develop and provide an integrated office automation system. The system is designed to improve internal management, revenue collection taxpayer service and communication with communities. The contract will bring a range of Digital products to the DOR including VAXcluster systems, All-IN-1 office and information system software, local area networking tools, and as many as 300 computer workstations. It will also cover software, DECsite network installation, training and other services.

The new \$5 million Digital system will be implemented over a three-year period. Within the first year, the Department will be able to integrate and accelerate data management for faster identification of tax evaders, easier handling of increased workloads, and more timely correspondence with taxpayers, practitioners and the state's 351 cities and towns.

"We are pleased to be able to offer the DOR a total solution to its office automation needs," said Robert F. Trocchi, Manager, State and Local Government, Digital. "Our ALL-IN-1 office and information system and local area networking will help meet the highly demanding information management requirements of the DOR now and in the future." ■

## Additional ESPP deduction announced

Starting Thursday, July 17, 1986, employees who have elected the supplementary contribution option for the Employee Stock Purchase Plan for the period June 1, 1986 through November 30, 1986 will have an additional deduction over the last 20 weeks of the payment period. The additional deduction is equal to the purchase price of \$51 minus any rollover and divided by 20.

The supplementary contribution option is a deduction above the percent deduction an employee elects to take when he or she joins the Employee Stock Purchase Plan. The deduction is based on the purchase price of the stock. The plan then takes any money that is left in the account, subtracts it from the purchase price and divides that amount over the last 20 weeks of the period. ■
