The 50th Anniversary Committee met in Riverside Hall this eve. at 8 o'clock. Chairman A. J. Conaghan Presided.

The various sub-committees offered reports all of which were accepted as progressive.

Regarding the matter of having a nurse stationed at the School home, Riverside Hall or other place it was voted the Program Committee should take up the suggestion and act as deemed advisable.

The matter of guns for moving salute was discussed, also music and decorating.

Voted to leave music arrangements entirely to Music Committee.

Voted to appropriate \$330. for decorating under direction of Decorating Committee.

An unsigned card was read by the Chairman suggesting the Committee advise the sale of fire works, horns etc, April 18th and 19th. A motion to ask the Selectmen to allow such sale was decisively voted down.

A letter from Mrs. Grace Merrick of the Maynard Woman's Club offering to support the celebration in any way the committee would suggest, was read by the chairman.

Voted to extend a vote of thanks to the Woman's Club for their interest and support, and the Secretary was instructed to write Mrs. Merrick to that effect.

A motion to hold a Ball on the evg. of April 19th was lost.

Voted to leave all arrangements

in regard to community singing
to that committee.

Voted to grant Printing Committee
full authority with reference to Budget
for committee.
