

Digital donates major computer system to the Shriners Burns Institute

The Shriners Burns Institute has received a VAX-11/750 computer system and 25 Professional 350 series personal computers from Digital. The equipment, valued at \$475,000, was donated by Digital through its Corporate Contributions Program.

Dr. John T. Fallon, chief of the Pathology Unit, Shriners Burns Institute of Boston, said about the donation, "In order for the Institute to continue to carry out its goals of treatment, research, and education, and for the Institute to remain at the forefront of burn care, it is imperative that the hospital acquire an integrated computer system to provide management of clinical laboratory and re-

Nancy A. Dube, manager, Corporate Community Relations, remarked, "It has long been Digital's policy to support respected institutions engaged in the advancement of medical technology and scientific knowledge. In addition, we place primary emphasis on those hospitals providing high quality specialized care. The Shriners Burns Institute is clearly in the forefront of treatment for acutely burned children and Digital is proud to be in a position

to contribute to the success of such a fine institution.'

The VAX-11/750 and Professional 350 computers will be linked through an Ethernet[®] local area network to existing computer systems within the Institute and the Massachusetts General Hospital Cardiac Computer Center. The VAX system will serve as the Institute's central computer, supporting all areas, including clinical, administration, and research.

The Shriners Burns Institute in Boston is one of three hospitals designed to meet the special needs of both acutely burned and postburn children and is supported solely by the Shrine philanthropy. The Boston Unit, a 30-bed acute and reconstructive care facility, opened in November, 1968. Research at the Shriners Institutes has provided new and innovative techniques in the treatment of severely burned children that has not only saved many lives, but also has aided in the prevention of the crippling effects of severe burns, thereby making a normal life possible for thousands of burn victims.

Two U.S. sales programs recruit 400 employees

The U.S. Field is introducing two new sales programs and wants to fill them with eligible employees who are interested in developing a new career in sales. Digital has announced PRO/Associate, a new software package that enables a second terminal to be attached to the company's Professional series work-stations.

Ideally suited for executives and their assistants in a variety of fields, the PRO/Associate package enables two users to share processor resources and peripherals, which results in a significant reduction in workstation cost per terminal. For current owners of Professional 350 and 380 workstations, PRO/Associate is a way of nearly doubling the effectiveness of the workstation for little more than the cost of a video terminal.

Software provided for the second terminal in the PRO/Associate package includes the PRO/DATATRIEVE data management program, communications software that pro-

vides both PRO/DECnet support and PRO/Communications, a login/logout facility, and file, disk/diskette, and print services. In addition, there are two optional software packages available: CT°OS/Associate word processing and the Supercomp-Twenty/Associate spreadsheet. To run any software package on the Associate terminal, the standard version must be purchased and installed on the main system.

PRO/Associate software runs under Version 2.0 of the P/OS operating system. It is licensed at \$400. Deliveries are immediate.

Requirements for a PRO/Associate configuration include a Professional 350 or 380 system with 10 Mbyte hard disk, P/OS operating system, and VT200-family terminal. Hardware options include dot-matrix and letter-quality printers, moderns, and a DECnet/Ethernet controller.

Digital expands service of selected non-Digital hardware products

Digital has expanded the number of selected non-Digital hardware products it will service for its mixed vendor customers.

Under the company's DECompatible Service offering, Digital's Field Service organization will now maintain and service more than 120 specific non-Digital hardware products, when linked to a Digital system. These designated products will receive the same response time and service coverage as Digital hardware under standard service agreements.

Digital and AT&T announce successful completion of joint connectivity testing

Digital and AT&T have successfully completed joint connectivity testing for AT&T's System 75 and System 85 PBXs with Digital's computers, terminals, personal computers, and data communications equipment.

"The successful completion of these connectivity tests with a leading PBX vendor is important to users who want PBX's as part of their data network," said Bob Murray, manager of Networks and Communications Marketing.

A representative sample of equipment and common configurations from both companies was used in the connectivity testing. Digital provided a VAX computer, a VT100, VT200, Rainbow 100+, PRO 350, PDP-11, and DECmate II, while AT&T provided the System 75 and System 85 PBXs and its appropriate data communications equipment.

"Connectivity testing with important computer equipment vendors like Digital demonstrates AT&T's continued commitment to provide and support standard interfaces via our internal Information Systems Architecture for communication connection," said Pramode Verma, District manager for Systems Interfaces.

Connections between the System 75 and System 85 PBXs and Digital's computer equipment were made over EIA RS-232C industry standard interfaces using AT&T's processor data modules and digital terminal data modules. Connectivity tests used asynchronous connections at speeds of up to 19.2 Kbps over single channels. ■

A-to-Z on MicroVAX II expands markets for resellers

Digital has announced the availability of its A-to-Z Integrated Software system on the powerful MicroVAX II family of computers.

"With the advent of A-to-Z on the Micro-VAX II, Digital's resellers now have the opportunity to reach new classes of potential customers and expand the market for their existing vertical applications," said Jim Willis, manager, Business Computer Group. "Small business customers will be assured that they are getting a state-of-the art solution from a company committed to small business," he said.

A-to-Z may be used by software developers and OEMs to migrate the more than 1,600 high quality business software packages available on the VAX line of computers to the small business market, and as a development tool for additional vertical applications. "We have many software developers and OEMs bringing their software to the new MicroVAX II, and we're always looking for more applications that will benefit small business customers," said Don Byrne, A-to-Z marketing manager. In addition, there is a wide variety of programming productivity tools that expedite conversion of application software from PDP-11 based machines to MicroVAX, and vice-versa. The MicroVAX II runs all popular programming languages, and MicroVMS has a very consistent file structure to accommodate software migration.

"The industry-standard architecture of the VAX family of systems preserves a software company's investment in product development, support and training. This is particularly important as a customer's business grows," Don added.

MicroVAX II systems with A-to-Z software are intended for Digital's network of Commercial OEMs, for sale to businesses with revenues under \$100 million.

"Digital works with more than 700 Commercial OEMs and software developers worldwide to offer small business an extensive range of industry specific software solutions," said Jim.

A typical system configuration with 2 MB of main memory, 4 VT220 terminals, 71 MB of hard disk storage, one TK50 cartridge tape drive, one four-line connection unit, an LA 210 printer and a pedestal cabinet that supports 4 users on the MicroVAX II is priced at \$34,145. That price includes the VMS operating system, A-to-Z Base System and A-to-Z Word Processing. A wide range of larger MicroVAX II systems with more memory, users and disk storage are also available. The A-to-Z integrated system works with all MicroVAX II family members, and will be available for delivery in September.

IVIS issued U.S. patent

Digital has announced that the IVIS multimedia workstation has been issued the U.S. Patent Number 4498098.

The IVIS (Interactive Video Information System) workstation was designed with a unique utilization of two color-encoding schemes, NTSC (National Television Signal Code) and RBG (Red, Blue, Green). The approach maintains the high resolution and full color quality of the computer-generated graphics when superimposed onto a standard, television quality picture.

The IVIS system also can provide the full color quality and synchronization of its graphics display while the other video source is searching or otherwise unusable.

The patent covers system architecture and hardware circuitry that interfaces a television quality video disk with a computer-based, high resolution, color graphics generator.

Designed for teaching large groups with varying levels of ability, the IVIS multimedia workstation integrates moving or still television pictures with computer-generated graphics, text, and stereophonic or bilingual soundtracks for colorful, dynamic, highly interactive training and informational programs.

IVIS is based on Digital's Professional 350 personal computing workstation and is marketed by Digital's Educational Services Group.

presenting the appropriate Digital solution and closing the sale are also included in the program.

SDP courses are custom designed by Digital and will culminate in the Sales Excellence Learning Laboratory (S.E.L.L.) which involves live lecture labs, self-paced video training materials, case studies, role playing and simulated sales situations.

The complete training program takes four to six months and will be offered at Digital's Hudson, N.H., site. Ability to relocate is a prerequisite to acceptance in SDP. Interested employees should send their resume to SDP Employment, mailstop OGO1-1/M11.

The second program is called the Target Sales Force (TSF). This program is designed for the employee with a current knowledge of Digital products and markets, or with some sales related experience. Wayne Furman, TSF manager, will be heading this new

organization in Merrimack, N.H.

TSF is a target sales organization in charge of making the new MicroVAX II a success through establishing new accounts and/or application penetration. TSF has set aggressive goals and will complement the existing Sales organization.

The new TSF Sales organization, which will number 200, including 50 pre-sales support positions, is designed for employees who, after a short orientation, will be prepared to aggressively pursue the MicroVAX II market.

Agressiveness, tenacity, and determination are key traits that must be combined with a knowledge of Digital products and markets. The U.S. Field organization's goal is to fill the 200 positions by August 31, 1985. 

Digital plans to build semiconductor plant in Scotland

Digital has announced plans to build a 200,000 square foot semiconductor manufacturing facility outside Edinburgh, Scotland to accommodate European demand for Digital's custom chips.

More than 80 percent of Digital's production of custom integrated circuits is for European demand. The new plant will employ 400 people recruited from around the area

and will supplement production of custom integrated circuits currently manufactured in the Hudson, Mass., semiconductor facility. The Edinburgh facility will work with Digital's existing plant in Ayr, Scotland, which assembles and test semiconductors.

Construction of the 86-acre site is scheduled to begin in mid-1986 and end in early 1988. ■
