

MAYNARD - Sixteen people and two teams have been selected to the Maynard High School Hall of Fame.

Inductions to the Hall are made every two years. This year, more than 60 names were submitted, according to Hall of Fame Chairman Ed Mullin.

"It's a non-scientific process," Mullin said. "It's a matter of picking who was good for Maynard athletics."

The people who were not nominated this year will be considered for the next class in 2011, Mullin said.

The list of inductees includes Gene and Gerry Robinson, twin brothers who were three-sport stars from the 1940s.

"I remember them a little bit," Mullin said. "Tremendous athletes."

According to Mullin, all the living inductees have been notified and have expressed an interest in attending the Hall of Fame ceremony, scheduled for Nov. 21 at the Maynard Elks.

"The Robinson twins live in the Carolina and they are very excited about coming back. They spoke with deep reverence for Maynard as a great place to grow up," Mullin said.
