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Digital reports strong revenue gains for the quarter and year

Digital continued to grow faster, with higher profits, than the computer industry. The company reported higher sales and increased earnings for the fourth quarter of its fiscal year, which ended July 2, 1988.

For the quarter, the company reported total operating revenues of \$3,339,439,000, up 25% from the \$2,669,064,000 of the comparable quarter a year ago. Net income for the quarter rose to \$401,013,000, up 6% from last year's fourth quarter net income of \$377,250,000. Quarterly earnings per share were \$3.08 versus \$2.85 last year.

For the full fiscal year just ended, Digital's total operating revenues rose 22% to \$11,475,446,000 compared with last year's total of \$9,389,444,000; net income reached \$1,305,633,000, up 15% from last year's \$1,137,435,000, and earnings per share for the year were \$9.90 compared with \$8.53 a year ago.

"We are pleased by the strong gains as our growth continued to outpace that of the industry," said Ken Olsen, president. "This performance reflects the growing number of large organizations around the world that are implementing Digital's enterprise-wide computing solutions.

"Demand was seen across the whole VAX family," said Ken. "At the low end, we shipped more than 12,000 workstations during the fourth quarter and 30,000 for the year, thus reaching a leadership position in this rapidly growing market. The MicroVAX 3000 series did particularly well, and over 500 VAX 6200 systems were shipped since their introduction three months ago. At the high end, shipment of VAX 8000 Nautilus systems exceeded 3,000 for the year. The introduction of Symmetrical Multi-Processing (SMP), which provides increased complex application performance, has been

very well received by our customers."

Jim Osterhoff, vice president, Finance, added: "Our product strategy continues to be well-suited to the marketplace, as evidenced by the enthusiasm for DEC-WORLD '88 in Europe this fall, and the recent positive reaction to the announcement of our transaction processing archi-

tecture, DECtp.

"Financially, we continue to perform well and compare favorably with the competition. But we expected to do better, building on our momentum of FY87.

"Our revenue growth is good, and employees should feel proud that their efforts helped maintain our sales momencontinued on page 12



International focus for five Industry Marketing groups

To deal more effectively with the increasing competitiveness in the computer industry, Jack Shields, senior vice president, Sales, Services, Marketing and International (SSMI) recently outlined a series of organizational changes.

"More than ever, we need to capture market share, grow in our strategic industries and accounts, and increase profitability. Most importantly, we need to set, agree, and execute strategies crisply while maximizing the use of our resources," Jack explained.

"Our goal is to plan by industry and execute by geography and to focus resources along one dimension—the account—and measure return along the other—geography. Profit and loss will be measured on several dimensions: industry, account, projects within an account, channel, and geography. Geographies are responsible for short-term profit and loss."

Five industry groups have been selected to play a leadership role in proposing and setting the global industry strategy. Financial Services, Telecommunications, Discrete Manufacturing, Process Manufacturing, and Government Systems are charged with leading the development of a worldwide plan, in addition to maintaining their current U.S. Industry Marketing responsibility. All other industry groups will remain committed to the plan and strategy for their particular geography.

In order to provide consistent management and implementation of the global industry strategy, the following senior managers are assuming the following responsibilities:

Bob Hughes will manage the Financial Services, Media, and General Services Industry groups. He will also be responsible for SSMI Marketing Communications. (Ed Kamins will now report to Bob in this role.) Bob will continue to have cross-industry responsibility for the Consultants and Information Systems

Jack MacKeen will manage Telecommunications Industry Marketing. He will also be responsible for Corporate Channels Marketing. Given that distribution management/strategy are the responsibility of the Sales organization, those groups in the current Channels Marketing organization that have provided support to U.S. Sales will transfer to the U.S. Sales organization, and be managed by Jay Atlas. Jack will continue to manage a cross-industry Corporate Channels group which will provide increased leadership in worldwide marketing-partner management, channel development, and corporate channel strategy. He will continue to chair the Channels Strategy Committee. (Dan Latham, the Telecommunications Industry Marketing Director, will now report to Jack.)

Harvey Weiss will manage the Government Systems Industry Marketing group. He will also have cross-industry responsibility for the Installed Systems Marketing group (formerly called PSG) and Products Operations.

Jerry Witmore will manage Basic Industry Marketing. He will also manage the Price/Discount Strategy Committee, with responsibility for leading Digital's global value-added pricing activities.

Software Services and U.S., Europe, and GIA Sales will each present a plan as to how to align the efforts of their organiza-

tions to support the global industry direction. Each will also propose senior members of their organizations to serve as Sales Industry managers and Software Industry/Applications managers to participate in the development and execution of the integrated plan by industry. Each of these senior managers, while reporting to their respective geographic organizations, will be part of the Industry Business Unit team which will be chaired by the industry director.

The concept behind the establishment and growth of Corporate Accounts has proven successful. Corporate Account managers will now report into the geography where the Corporate Account is headquartered. Aligned by industry, these Corporate Accounts represent the keystone accounts in Digital's integrated plan by industry.

Certain of these accounts have been selected as global accounts. The Corporate Account manager will have worldwide responsibility for resource planning and deployment. These account managers will report to a senior host geographic manager in their respective geographies.

The central Corporate Accounts group will continue to be managed by Bill Lynch and will be responsible for resource standards and methodologies for Digital's Corporate Accounts. Bill's group will continue to manage Corporate Visits, the Technology Review Program, the Corporate Leaders' Forum, and other similar programs. The Industry Sales managers representing U.S. Sales to the Industry Business Unit teams will also report to Bill. Bill will report to Chick Shue, vice president, U.S. Sales, in both the Corporate Accounts and U.S. Industry Sales roles. •

DECtp: Digital's transaction processing environment

Digital's new systems environment, DECtp, integrates the capabilities of such transaction processing elements as databases, monitors and storage systems.

The products were announced at a major news conference in New York City on July 19.

Transaction processing is data moving from the user back out to the database, changing the database and then telling the user the database has been changed properly. Without sophisticated TP systems, services such as automatic teller machines and credit checks at the sales counter wouldn't be available.

The new DECtp products include DECintact, a new high-performance TP monitor; an improved VAX ACMS TP monitor; higher-performance versions of the VAX Rdb/VMS relational database management systems and supporting software; DEClink software, which increases a VAX system's ability to access IBM-based databases, and the SA600 storage array, a technology-leading disk storage system with nearly double the capacity of storage products used on mainframes.

"Digital has been in transaction processing for a long time and is among the largest suppliers to the market," said Ken Olsen, president. "But our customers are asking us to do more. Our new announcement includes products, support, services, and a strategy for the future that provides customers with the most useful transaction processing capabilities available anywhere."

The DECtp program is designed to

work across Digital's complete range of systems. This allows users to provide as much computing power as each application requires, without rewriting the application. DECtp also facilitates flexible, incremental system growth as users' needs grow. In addition, information from large, already established databases on IBM mainframes can be utilized in the more flexible DECtp environment.

DECtp users can implement TP applications and then exchange data throughout the enterprise. With other vendors' systems, TP often is isolated and can't interact with other applications.

Industry experts generally believe that the TP market is the fastest-growing segment of the business computer market.

Network Training Program begins Sept. 12

Space is available in the next offering of the Network Training Program (NTP), which begins Monday, Sept. 12, and runs until June 1989. The deadline for applications is Friday, Aug. 19. This is the only offering of this program in FY89.

NTP is designed to help Digital Information Systems meet the critical shortage of skilled personnel to support Digital's internal network environment. The program trains students to become a telecommunications analyst or a network management specialist.

The program has been modified to better meet the needs of Digital's Telecommunications managers. Instead of 20 consecutive weeks of training, the new model will deliver one week of classroom training each month for 10 months. The remaining three weeks of each month will be spent at the student's work site in "onthe-job" training. Thus, in most months, three full weeks are given for the student to work with newly acquired skills.

The Network Training Program curriculum includes training in virtually every aspect of networks, as well as system management and design, negotiation and presentation skills, and financial concepts for telecommunications.

Prospective students should complete the "VAX/VMS Utilities and Commands" course or have equivalent experience, along with having solid basic math skills, analytical ability, computer literacy with some programming and basic financial/business skills.

Applicants will be recommended for enrollment by their managers. The Network Training Program Selection Committee will review the required applicant documentation and interview candidates.

tum during some uncertain economic times. Looking at the last two years, our 22% growth in the year just ended followed a 24% increase in FY87. Since 1986, our revenues have grown from \$7.6 billion to \$11.5 billion, or over 50%.

"The same is true for earnings. In FY87, we improved net income by 84% and in FY88 we added a further net income gain of 15%. In absolute terms, we have built on our prior year's achievement. Also, we have made substantial investments in new products, software applications, new manufacturing technologies and a broader customer base. These investments were indeed substantial. What we must do now is concentrate on

earning a return on these investments."

"We continued to see international operations flourish, as we have for the past several quarters," said Jack Shields, senior vice president. "Business was good in Europe, as well as in Japan, Canada, and in the Caribbean and Latin American countries. Non-U.S. revenues represented 50% of our overall business for the year."

"Our European customers continue to provide substantial growth for Digital," said Pier Carlo Falotti, president, Digital-Europe, "as organizations continued to take advantage of Digital's distributed computing environment of one computer family that stretches from the desktop to the data center."

"Initial reaction to our DECtp introduction, held July 19, has been very enthusiastic," noted Jack Smith, senior vice president. "DECtp is the leading price/ performance distributed transaction processing system, and features a completely integrated software, hardware and service package. The major components of DECtp are DECintact, our newest transaction processing monitor; VAX Rdb/VMS Version 3, a high performance relational database monitor; the SA600 storage array, a 9.7 billion-byte thin film disk system of our own design; and expert transaction processing system design, installation and operation services for our customers."
