## **ACTIVITYLINE**

In addition to WAVM, the various bands, and the Student Government, there are many other activities for students that you may not know of. One of these is Students Against Driving Drunk (SADD). This was begun this year so that MHS students can come together to keep their friends from drinking and driving.

The Library Aids try to help students find important information and help Mrs. Wasiuk keep the library clean.

The Foreign Language Club is comprised of students who are studying a foreign language. The club tries to enhance the knowledge and understanding of other countries for its members.

The National Art Honor Society was established by the National Art Education Association in 1978 and came to MHS in 1982. Students in grades 10-12 who excel in art scholarship, service, and character and maintain an 85 average are eligible for membership.

Many students participate in the Math League and/or the Math Olympiad. The Math league members take a 6-question test each month. Olympiad members take a much more extensive test annually.

The Senior Executive Board works to organize Senior activities such as dances, fund raisers, Class Night, Senior Tea, and the Coup de Grace . . . Graduation!

Students participating in the Academic Decathalon compete against students from all over New England by taking tests dealing with subjects ranging from math to art. The competition ends with the super Quiz and the winning team goes to the state finals.

Each year, one boy and one girl from the Junior class with exemplary records of academics and extracurricular activities are selected to receive the Harvard Book Award.

Several students sit in on school committee meetings and report on whatever is decided upon to the Student Government. Upon these few is bestowed the title of School Committee Representatives.
