THE INNKEEPER'S CAT

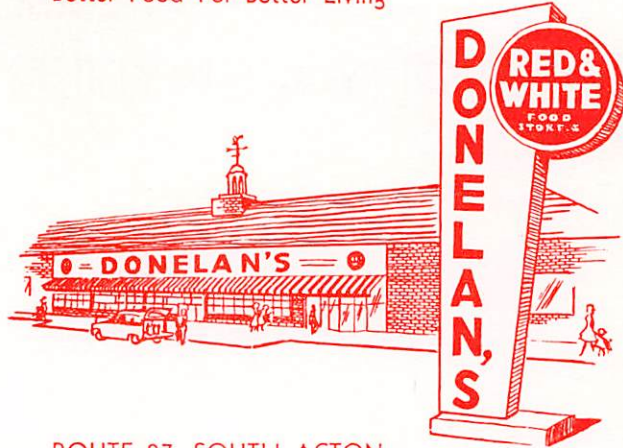
The cat climbed into blazing night

THE CHRISTMAS TREE

There are many explanations, most of them legendary, concerning the origin of the Christmas Tree. The fact that in pre-Christian times the evergreen was worshipped, used as a symbol of immortality, and because of its constant verdancy was thought to possess various magical properties, has complicated the problem of historical accuracy. Furthermore, aside from the specific idea of the Christmas Tree, evergreen decorations in the home at Yule time have been popular among many central European peoples, from pre-Christian times.

But the Christmas Tree, as we think of it today, originated rather late and stems from Christian, rather than pagan, tradition. Essentially, it comes from two medieval religious symbols — the Paradise Tree and the Christmas Light. In fact, in some countries — the symbol of Light is still used and never did merge into a tree custom.

During medieval times, before the invention of movable type, when books were hand-written and too expensive and rare to be widely used, much religious teaching was provided through the medium of the drama. Religious plays, known as 'miracle plays' were often performed in Churches or on a rough platform in the churchyard. They were called miracle plays because they depicted the miracles wrought by Christ and the early saints. One of the most popular of these plays told the biblical story of creation, of Adam eating the forbidden fruit, and their expulsion from Paradise. The only stage decoration used was a fir tree, hung with apples, which represented the forbidden tree. Popularly, it became known as the 'Paradise Tree'. Because the play closed with the promise of the coming of Christ, it was presented during Advent, as a means of preparing for Christmas.

In the fifteenth century, miracle plays were abandoned because of the abuses and irreverence which had crept in. But in continuing the observance of the feast day of Adam and Eve on December 24, people erected Paradise Trees in their homes. Although the Roman Church never officially recognized sainthood for Adam and Eve, the Eastern Churches did, and the custom of observing this feast day came into Europe.

To December 24, Christmas Eve, belonged another religious custom — the Christmas Light, symbolizing the birth of Christ as the Light of the World. In various countries it was customary to build a small pyramid-like frame, usually decorated with tinsel and glass balls, with a candle placed on top. In Germany (about the 16th century) people began combining these two ideas — the fir tree with its apples was now given the tinsel and glass balls and the light on its top, and, to remind themselves that this was no longer a tree of sin, cookies and other good things were added to symbolize the religious significance of the 'sweet fruit of Christ's salvation of mankind.' The Christmas crib, formerly placed at the foot of the pyramid, now took its place under the tree, and the star of Bethlehem took the shape of the star at the treetop. A German manuscript of 1605 is the first mention of this adaptation. From 1800 on, the idea spread swiftly throughout Europe and was brought to America by the immigrants.

Each country adopting the Christmas tree added its own ornament ideas to the fruit, glass balls and tinsel with which it started. Each addition involved some legendary or actual idea symbolizing man's homage to the newborn King. Though some of these ideas originated in superstition, they were not intended as an expression of such, but rather a symbolization of the idea that the coming of Christ meant the end of the darkness of pre-Christian belief.

THE CRECHE

It was the absence of books and the illiteracy of the times which prompted St. Francis of Assisi in 1224 to dramatize the birthday of Jesus with the first manger scene. In his desire to bring home to the people of the little village of Greccio a realization of the humble beginnings of Christ and the significance of Christmas, he reconstructed the Bethlehem scene in a cave, using live animals and people to illustrate the Nativity.

The vividness of this experience, bringing the first Christmas to life, was so appealing that the idea spread throughout Europe and the Christian world. At first the annual manger scenes continued to use live domestic animals and, as a result, began the legend that at Christmas time all animals joined in the worship of the Infant. They were said to receive the gift of speech at midnight on Christmas Eve.

Christmas cribs were first confined to churches and people brought gifts to the Infant Child, with the wealthy contributing jewels and robes for the costumes. Later hand-carved woden figures came into use, many of them life size, and, as the popularity of the custom grew, there was great competition to produce the most elaborate and lavish manger scenes.

Many of the great castles of Europe had their own chapels, and to provide a suitable manger scene nobles and kings hired the leading artists of the times to produce lavish creations.

In this competitive spirit the artists of the seventeenth and eighteenth centuries rose to the challenge and the settings took a great variety of forms. Many figures were added to the Nativity scene, including representations of the nobleman who financed the project, members of his household, and his servants. There were figures representing the various social classes, as well, all clad in the dress of the day, so that crib art became a kind of contemporary social history as well as a new art medium.

Movement was added to the figures by ingenious craftsmen, and today some of the most famous examples of these Christmas cribs may be seen in the museums throughout Europe.

One of the best known of these early cribs is now in Rome in the Basilica of Saints Cosmas and Damian. Forty-five feet long, twenty feet wide, and twenty-seven feet high, it includes several hundred figures, all hand carved of wood; its sky had stars and a moon; there are the traditional angels and shepherds; the surrounding countryside includes trees, farm animals, and people performing their daily tasks; there are buildings ranging from an inn to a castle, and a thousand other details.

Many families also made their own Christmas cribs, and the Christmas festivities were centered around these home creations.

In Poland it is called the 'Złóbek' — in Italy it is called the 'Praesepe' — in France it is the 'Creche' — in Germany the 'Krippe' — in Spain the 'Nacimiento'. Wherever Christmas is celebrated today, there is a Christmas crib. The Christmas crib was brought to America by the various immigrants who came to settle here. But there is one city in America which has become famous for its distinctive Christmas crib tradition — Bethlehem, Pennsylvania, appropriately named and now known as the Christmas City of America. It was Christmas Eve, in 1741, that Nicholas Louis, the Count of Zingendorf, and a group of Moravian pioneers, seeking the religious freedom of the New World, named the settlement after the birthplace of Christ.

With them they brought their 'Putz' tradition — the elaborate manger scenes carved of wood which have been handed down from generation to generation now, and which are still being improved as each family makes its contribution. The most inspiring of these is the Community Putz which tells the Christmas story in seven scenes with more than two hundred buildings, the most noted of which is an accurately scaled reproduction of Herod's temple. A real stream of water runs through the Putz, which rests on fifty bushels of moss. It is annually displayed from December 16 to January 2 in the First Moravian Church there.

CHRISTMAS IS OFTEN SAID TO BE FOR CHILDREN

It were more truly said to be for the family. For this great holiday celebrating the birth of the Infant Jesus is also, in a sense, a feast of the Holy Family, bringing to mind, as it does, the blessings, the trials, the joys, sorrows, and anxieties of Mary and Joseph. What mother does not kneel before the manger of Bethlehem pondering in her heart the miracle of birth? What father does not stand in kinship with Joseph as he recalls the fears and anxieties of providing for Mother and Child?

THE LITTLE FAMILY OF THE FIRST CHRISTMAS IS EVERY MAN'S FAMILY. The traditions of Christmas in every land center upon the family and its symbols of security—the hearth and the home. The special magic of Christmas is for everyone, and through its traditions and customs the bonds of family are renewed and strengthened.

POLAND'S CHRISTMAS TRADITIONS

The "Star of Bethlehem" sets the theme for Poland's Christmas traditions. The first star in the evening sky on December 24 signals the end of the Christmas fast and the beginning of the Festival of the Star.

Straw is spread under the table in remembrance of the stable in Bethlehem and a chair is left vacant for the Holy Child.

Before the meal begins the tradition of the Peace Wafer is observed. The wafers are small, round and flat, similar to those used in Communion. Previously blessed by the village priest, these wafers are distributed by the head of the family to all those around the table, with an exchange of good wishes. This symbolizes the peace and friendship of those present and comes from the ancient tradition of 'breaking bread'. Following this simple ceremony dishes of mush, fish, and almonds are included in the meal. Token gifts, such as sugar hearts, cookies, or a silver coin are placed on each plate.

After supper the children are examined on their knowledge of religion by the Star Man (usually the village priest), after which they receive small gifts from the Wise Men, impersonated by three young men who carry a star and sing carols. The gifts are believed to come from the stars, with the Wise Men acting as emissaries. It is customary for the young people in the rural areas to accompany the Wise Men on their mission, dressed as animals or as characters from the Nativity scene symbolizing all those privileged to attend the Birth of the Christ Child. They go from house to house singing carols and are welcomed with a glass of wine and cookies. Some of the group may carry small stages which depict various biblical scenes or incidents.

Although the Polish Christmas tree may have many varieties of ornaments, and will differ in the city and in the country, stars in many varieties will be found on all. Red and white, the national colors, are popular in intricate paper decorations.

Heart-shaped ornaments are also used and much artistry is found in the various bird forms on the tree. The Polish royal crest is also used for decoration.

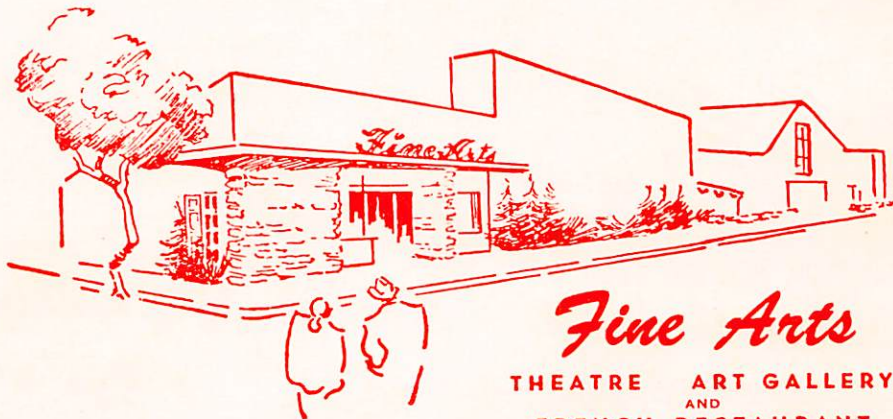
