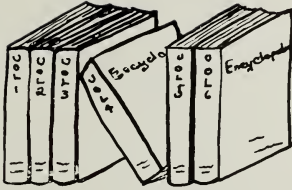
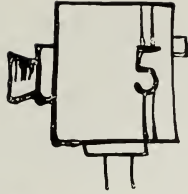


The Officers
