Two win first prize

Rather than choose between two excellent entries, judges awarded two first prizes in Digital's nationwide United Way poster contest. Run for Fun -- Sept. 16

Many Digital facilities will hold Fun Runs to publicize the United Way campaign. Maynard has scheduled its run for Sept. 16 (rain date Sept. 19) at PK3. All Digital employees, not just those in Maynard, are welcome to participate.

The rules have been changed a bit from last year to help encourage employees to pledge contributions. There will be no prizes for simply running.

If you want to participate, you should get fellow employees to promise to pledge a specified amount to the United Way for each lap that you run. (One lap around PK3 equals .535 miles.) All participants must have pledges, and each participant with five or more pledges will receive a T-shirt with a winning design from this year's poster contest.

Printed Circuit Development Center opens

To keep pace with advancing technology and to meet the needs of the company's circuit designers, Digital has opened its first facility dedicated to process development for printed circuit boards. It is a small operation--four environmentally controlled rooms, tucked away in the basement of ML3, near the board shop and the model shop. But it represents "a down payment on a major endeavor," says Alvin Sorkin, manager of advanced technology printed circuit boards.

Previously, development work was fit in with regular production work. But the higher density and sensitivity of today's semiconductor devices

(such as those made at our new Hudson plant) require higher density and tighter tolerances in the circuit boards on which they are mounted. To produce state-of-the-art circuit boards in high volume with high yields requires tighter environmental controls than in the past--just how tight the controls should be is one of the questions the new development center is meant to answer.

"The new manufacturing plant being built in Greenville, S.C., will produce the type of boards being developed here," explains Dave Widder, manager of module development with the Advanced Manufacturing Technology Group. "Their equipment and modifications will be specified based on what we learn here. This is the proving ground for process and equipment and the training ground for manufacturing managers."

"We are evaluating new tools to see if they are appropriate for volume production," says Gowri Sankar, consulting engineer with the project. "We are testing to find out what factors have the greatest impact on yield, exactly where special care is needed and what you have to do to modify work procedures, equipment and process controls to get better yield."

Today the typical circuit board in production at Digital has 12 mil (12/1000 inch) wide lines and spaces and one line between the pads on which the contacts of semiconductor devices mount. The environmental controls at this development facility make it possible to produce boards with 5 mil (5/1000 inch) lines and spaces and with two lines between pads on each signal layer-doubling or

even tripling the amount of circuitry that can be fit onto a board. According to Widder, "We intend to work on three lines between pads and on multi-signal-layer boards. We have already made an 11 layer board here with four signal layers." The facility is also equipped to experiment with high temperature, high reliability materials, such as polyimide.

This operation is known as "Phase I." According to Bruce Short. manager of Phase II, the next step will be a shop about five times the size of this one-including a process development lab, a prototype shop and a new process startup line to check out advanced techniques before introducing them to production. Andover is mentioned as a possible location.

Health insurance -time to reassess your choices

It's the annual enrollment time for health insurance and Health Maintenance Organizations (HMOs) --Sept. 5-19. If you wish to switch from John Hancock medical coverage to health care through an HMO or from an HMO to Hancock, you must do so no later than Sept. 19. You only need to take action if you wish to change your present medical coverage.

This enrollment does not affect your life insurance, dental coverage, long term disability or short term disability benefits.

An HMO is an organization of medical professionals who offer total health care for a prepaid monthly fee. With your John Hancock coverage, you select your doctor or hospital, and the insurance company pays all or part of the fees for most services.

In contrast, an HMO provides the health care itself or makes arrangements with specified doctors, hospitals and other medical providers. The HMO member agrees to receive health care from the professionals and hospitals associated with the HMO.

HMOs stress preventive health care, screening for high blood pressure and other health problems, performing routine preventive procedures such as physical exams and providing well baby care -- services that are not always covered by ordinary medical insurance.

The HMOs for the New England area are -- Harvard Community Health Plan in Boston, Matthew Thornton Health Plan in Nashua, N.H., Rhode Island Group Health Association in Providence and Fallon Community Health Plan in Worcester.

What is the United Way?

Each fall Digital facilities throughout the U.S. stage a variety of events to encourage donations to the United Way, a nonprofit fund-raising organization. In the Boston area, United Way of Massachusetts Bay supports 167 human care agencies that deliver health, counselling, family, child care and youth services to more than 650,000 people.

Last year Digital employees pledged \$515,670. The company matched that donation, bringing Digital's total nationwide contribution to over \$1 million. That money went to Massachusetts Bay and over 130 other local United Way organizations.

This year's campaign will run Sept. 15 - Oct. 17. Digital facilities will be competing with one another for the honor of having the highest percentage of employee participation. Last year Woburn received the plaque for highest participation for a plant with over 500 employees and Salem Seneral Manufacturing for a plant with under 500 employees. Those plaques will be passed along to this year's winners.

allocates its funds by a review process in which volunteers, who represent a cross-section of the community, review and evaluate each agency's performance. In 1980 they have distributed \$17 million that was raised in last year's campaign. About a quarter of that went to agencies that provide social services for families, individuals and children. Another quarter went to community organizations and special services such as Red Cross, the Urban League, Combined

Jewish Philanthropies, Jobs for Youth and Greater Boston Legal Services. About 18% went to youth development agencies, such as Boy Scouts, Girl Scouts, Campfire Girls, YMCAs, YWCAs and Boys' Clubs. Neighborhood centers and independent camps received 14%, and health, rehabilitation, visiting nurse and home care agencies received another 14%. Of each dollar contributed, 87° goes to these agencies, and 13° is spent on administrative and fund-raising costs.
